

EBOO TWO-DAY TRAINING SUPPLY LIST

(FOR EBOO FULL SPECTRUM FROM O3UV)

Equipment & Supplies Obtained through O3UV:		
□ EBOO Full Spectrum UBI Device and Cart □ Tubing for Connecting O2 to EBOO Device □ EBOO Diffuser and Tubing w/Quartz Cuvette □ Magnetic Timer □ Collection Cup □ Blue Clamps/Hemostats □ O2 Regulator (for O2 Tank)		
Disposable Supplies Clinic Sources (Per Therapy):		
Medical Grade Oxygen Tank – E-tank is best for EBOO therapy – you should get ~11 treatments from one tank		
 500mL Normal Saline – this could be 2-250mL, 1-500mL, or if you can only get 1L bags, you can use them but some will be wasted 		
• 500mL or 1L Lactated Ringers		
• 250mL D5W (5% Dextrose in Water).		
· 7500 units of Heparin		
Regular Unfiltered IV Admin Tubing – for Heparin drip		
30ml (or larger) Syringe – for air regulation

2 Tegaderm Dressing

- 220G needles

Alcohol swabs

Gauze

The above supplies listed are what is needed for each individual therapy. Although your initial EBOO purchase includes 10 EBOO Diffuser and Tubing w/Quartz Cuvettes, you will likely use most of these during the 2-day on-site training session. We recommend you purchase additional EBOO Diffuser and Tubing w/Quartz Cuvettes, so you have the needed supplies to treat patients immediately after the training session.

PLEASE NOTE: This Onsite EBOO Training Session is 2 FULL days of training and will require you close your office to regular patients for these 2 days to complete the training without interruptions.

Patient Volunteers:

The 2-day training schedule should allow time to administer four (4) therapies each day for a total of eight (8) therapies. You will need 8 different patient volunteers.

Note: Since this is a training event, it is recommended you use staff members instead of actual patients.

QUALIFYING YOUR PATIENT	PREPARING YOUR PATIENT
Has had reasonable dose of ozone at least once, within a few months prior Has two good veins to access Has been educated on the procedure Risk/Benefits Expectations have been set Signed consent to treat Does not have any contraindications Has healthy vitals No allergies to Heparin or other anti-coagulant Can tolerate saline or other carrier Reasonable blood pressure Low O2 OK	Labs (if desired) – CBC, CMP, G6PD Eat protein prior to treatment Hydrate well Oral antioxidants up to two weeks in advance Nitric Oxide given three days prior for better vasodilation (We recommend Apex Energetics liquid Nitric Balance (liquid works quickly.) Blood-sugar above 110 (We recommend purchasing a glucometer, if you do not have one.)
